Over a period of seven years we had a stirring in our hearts that we would leave South Korea, the land we had served for twenty-seven years, to embark on other lands where the good news was not yet known. We were ready. God made us ready. We headed back to the United States to regroup, rest, pray and seek God out for his perfect will. Through a chain of events we were challenged to start afresh with the support of a church in Bedford, Indiana in 1997. A board of directors was subsequently formed and in 1998, we became Christ Reaching Asia Mission Worldwide, Incorporated. In 2001, we were accredited by the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability (ECFA). Our bylaws state that CRAM Worldwide is a non-profit, non-government organization dedicated to helping the poor, feeding the hungry, healing the sick and providing education. Our encouragement rests in the promise found in John 15:16, *"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit – fruit that will last. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name. This is my command: Love each other."*

Feeding the 5000



Our first major project for two and half years was the Feeding the 5000 Project in North Korea. From 2002 to 2004, we supported a local program four thousand dollars a month to feed five thousand children one cup of soymilk a day. A milk truck was purchased by CRAM to facilitate the delivery of fresh soymilk over a fifty kilometer radius.

Food for North Korea



Several food projects have been undertaken in North Korea. In the beginning of 2004 twenty tons of corn were purchased in the United States and sent to Rajin and used to support the workers on CRAM's various projects. In the end of 2004 twenty tons of flour were purchased in China and sent to North Korea to be used by the citizens of Rajin. In February of 2005 twenty tons of rice were purchased in China and sent to North Korea to support the workers on CRAM's various projects.

Vietnam



With faith our work in Vietnam began in 1998. We taught, trained, encouraged and loved those we came into contact. It was clearly evident that the people were hungry for knowledge of Him. We worked in the countryside with those in leper colonies supplying them with food, cattle and medical supplies. In 2000 we set out to establish an orphanage in the city of Haiphong. Phillip's Hope for Children was established in the summer of that year caring for up to thirty-five children. The teens stayed with relatives with our support and the children up to five years of age were directly under our care. Toward the end of 2002 we were prevented from reentering the country. The orphanage was subsequently closed and the children placed in the homes of relatives. We financially supported our contacts through June of 2003. It is still our hope and prayer to return to this land one day. We trust His perfect timing.

Livestock



The Livestock Project was started in 2004 to purchase cows and goats for the work in China and North Korea. The beef and goat's milk will be utilized to feed the children and workers on the various projects supported by CRAM. The cost of one cow is five hundred dollars and for one goat fifty dollars.
